This will be Tony's last year in post as he intends to stand down at the CS AGM.

Bullet points from Tony's talk.

"The past year has been dominated by racism issues which have resulted in a review into racism. This process will be hard and painful and will result in action to be taken. We will have to cooperate with Sport Scotland and do what they tell us.

CS want cricket to be inclusive and exemplify what Sport Scotland want. This in turn will make the sport better respected and hopefully more attractive to players and supporters.

We should be proud of how cricket recovered in 2021 giving us virtually a full season.

We discovered how much we take for granted and how much we missed it.

Particular comment to Tony McKenna and colleagues for working to develop cricket.

The Men's national team got through the 1st round of the World Cup – something they had not achieved before."

Tony was asked if there was any financial benefit from the World Cup result. The answer is, not directly, however it means Scotland will qualify for the T20 world cup in Australia and with that comes a fee.

He was also asked if there was a timescale for the racism review. It is hoped to be the end of July 2022.
