# THE SPIRIT OF CRICKET A PREAMBLE TO THE MCC LAWS

Cricket is a game that owes much of its unique appeal to the fact that it should be played not only within its Laws, **but also within the Spirit of the Game**.

Any action which is seen to abuse this spirit causes injury to the game itself.

The major responsibility for ensuring the spirit of fair play rests with the team <u>captains</u>.

- There are two Laws which place responsibility for the team's conduct firmly on the captain.
  - Responsibility of captains the captains are responsible at all times for ensuring that play is conducted within the Spirit of the Game as well as within the Laws.
  - Player's conduct in the event of a player failing to comply
    with instructions by an umpire, or criticising by word or
    action the decision of an umpire, or showing dissent, or
    generally behaving in a manner which might bring the game
    into disrepute, the umpire concerned shall in the first place
    report the matter to the other umpire and to the player's
    captain, and instruct the latter to take action.

#### 2. Fair and unfair play.

- According to the Laws the umpires are the sole judges of fair and unfair play.
- The umpires may intervene at any time and it is the responsibility of the captain to take action where required.

#### 3. The umpires are authorised to intervene in cases of:

- Time wasting
- · Damaging the pitch
- Dangerous or unfair bowling
- · Tampering with the ball
- · Any other action that they consider to be unfair

#### 4. The Spirit of the Game involves respect for:

- Your opponents
- · Your own captain
- · The roles of the umpires
- The game's traditional values

#### 5. It is against the Spirit of the Game:

- To dispute an umpire's decision by word, action or gesture
- To direct abusive language towards an opponent or umpire
- To indulge in cheating or any sharp practice, for instance:
  - i) to appeal knowing that the batsman is not out
  - ii) to advance towards an umpire in an aggressive manner when appealing
  - iii) to seek to distract an opponent either verbally or by harassment with persistent clapping or unnecessary noise under the guise of enthusiasm and motivation of one's own side

#### 6. Violence

• There is no place for acts of violence on the field of play.

#### 7. Players

 Captains and umpires together set the tone for the conduct of a cricket match. Every player is expected to make an important contribution towards this.

# ECB GUIDELINES FOR JUNIOR PLAYERS IN OPEN AGE GROUP CRICKET

- Making the step up from junior to open age group cricket is a significant event in any player's cricket experience. Ensure the player's safety, personal development needs and overall cricket experience are considered.
- Clubs, squad coaches and managers must take into account the requirements on age detailed in this guidance.
- Each case is to be determined on an individual basis, depending on the
  player's ability and stage of cognitive and emotional maturity to take part
  at this level however, the minimum age guidance provided below must
  be adhered to.

Boys and girls who are area squad players are able to play open age group cricket if they were at least 11 years old on 1st September of the year preceding the season.

Players who are **NOT** in an area squad must be a minimum of 12 years old on 1st September of the preceding year before being able to play in any open age group cricket.

#### n.b. written parental consent is required for these players.

- Juniors should be involved in all aspects of the game wherever possible i.e. socialising, team talks, practice, decision making and so on, so that they feel part of the team
- Children will often feel more comfortable and able to perform if they have a family member or friend also playing in the side.
- Provide an opportunity for players to show their talents in an appropriate way. Children who are just used as fielders will not fully experience the game.
- Be supportive, at all times, for all forms of effort even when children are not successful. Try and put them in situations where they will experience some success (however small) and ensure plenty of praise and encouragement.

# **RESTRICTIONS ON JUNIOR PLAYERS**

#### **PROTECTION**

- Helmets with a faceguard or grille MUST be worn when batting against a hard cricket ball in all matches and practice sessions.
- Young players should regard a helmet with a faceguard as a normal item of protective equipment when batting, together with pads, gloves and, for boys, an abdominal protector (box).
- Young wicket keepers must wear a helmet with a faceguard, or a wicketkeeper face protector when standing up to the stumps.

#### **FIELDING**

- No young player in the U15 age group, or younger, shall be allowed to field closer than 8 yards from the middle stump, except behind the wicket on the off side, until the batsman has played at the ball.
- For players in the U13 age group and below the distance is 11 yards (minimum distances apply even if the player is wearing a helmet)
- Should a young player in these age groups come within the restricted distance the umpire MUST stop the game immediately and instruct the fielder to move back
- In addition, any young player in the U16 to U18 age groups who has not reached the age of 18, must wear a helmet and, for boys, an abdominal protector when fielding within 6 yards of the bat, except behind the wicket on the off side (players should wear appropriate protective equipment whenever they are fielding in a position where they feel at risk).

#### **FAST BOWLING**

 To ensure that young fast bowlers do not place undue stress on their bodies, every attempt must be made to keep the amount of bowling within reasonable limits, as follows (for the purpose of this directives a fast bowler is defined as a bowler to whom a wicket keeper in the same age group would, in normal circumstances, stand back to take the ball).

Age *	Maximum per spell	Maximum per day
Up to 13	5 overs	10 overs
U14, U15	6 overs	12 overs
U16, U17	7 overs	18 overs
U18, U19	7 overs	18 overs

<sup>\*</sup> Age as at 1st September 2018

Captains <u>must</u> inform their opposite number and the umpires of the ages of all Junior players in their team before the toss is made.

#### **IMPORTANT CHANGES TO LAW 41.7 FOR 2019 SEASON**

#### No Ball for Height (aka 'Beamers')

As is already the case with short-pitched bowling, the **umpire will now decide** whether a full-pitched delivery is dangerous, based on various factors such as the speed or direction of the ball, repeated delivery of full tosses and the ability of the batsman.

There is no longer a 'catch-all' sanction, but umpires are now required to use their best judgement to determine whether a delivery is dangerous. If it is dangerous, it will lead to a first and final warning. If not, it will still be a No ball, but there will be no warning.

#### The Relevant Laws

- 41.7.1 Any delivery, which passes or would have passed, without pitching, above

  waist height of the striker standing upright at the popping crease, is unfair.

  When such a delivery is bowled, the umpire shall call and signal 'No Ball'.
- 41.7.2 The bowling of a delivery as defined above is also dangerous <u>if the bowler's end umpire considers that there is a **risk of injury to the striker**</u>. In making that judgement the umpire shall:
  - i. disregard any protective equipment worn by the striker
  - ii. be mindful of the speed, height and direction of the delivery
  - iii. be mindful of the skill of the striker
  - iv. be mindful of the repeated nature of such deliveries
- 41.7.3 If the umpire considers a non-pitching delivery (or a series of no-pitching deliveries) to be dangerous, when the ball is dead, the umpire shall repeat the No ball signal to the scorers and then caution the bowler, indicating that this is a first and final warning. The umpire shall also inform the other umpire, the captain of the fielding side and the batsmen of what has occurred. This caution shall apply to that bowler throughout the innings.
- 41.7.4 Should there be any further such delivery by the same bowler in that innings, the umpire shall call and signal No ball when the ball is dead, direct the captain of the fielding side to suspend the bowler from bowling and inform the other umpire for the reason for this action. The bowler thus suspended shall not be allowed to bowl again in that innings. If applicable, the over shall be completed by another bowler, who shall neither have bowled any part of the previous over, nor be allowed to bowl any part of the next over.
- 41.7.6 If the umpire considers that a bowler deliberately bowled a non-pitching delivery as defined above, then the caution and warning in 41.7.3 shall be dispensed with. The umpires together shall report the incident as soon as possible after the match to the Executive of the offending side

#### What is waist height?

#### **NEW PLAYING CONDITION - FREE HIT OFF ALL NO BALLS**

It has been agreed that **free hits** following a No Ball will apply in **all** NoSCA competitions in 2019.

#### All players (and particularly team captains) should note the following:

A batter cannot be given out off a No Ball, except:

- law 34 (hit the ball twice),
- law 37 (obstructing the field), or
- law 38 (run out).

Following the call of 'No Ball' the next delivery will be a **free hit**.

The umpire at the bowler's end signals that the next ball is a **free hit** by making circular movements in the air with one raised hand.

Fielders must remain in place for the **free hit**, except:

- If the No Ball is called for insufficient fielders inside a fielding circle (e.g. T20 competitions)
- If a RH/LH batting partnership change ends




If the **free hit** delivery is called Wide or a No Ball, then the free hit is carried over to the next ball; in this case the umpire is required to signal the **free hit** again.

For the avoidance of doubt, as with a No Ball, a batter cannot be given out off a **free hit**, except:

- law 34 (hit the ball twice),
- · law 37 (obstructing the field) or
- law 38 (run out).

# **A SIMPLE EXPLANATION OF LBW (LAW 36)**



- A Not Out. The ball wouldn't have hit the stumps end of story!
- **B Out** (<u>unless</u> the impact with the pad is outside the line of off stump and the batsman is playing a shot).
- **C Out**. So long as the umpire feels the ball would have hit the stumps and not missed the top.
- **D Out**. The ball pitched <u>on</u> the line of leg stump and would have gone on to hit the stumps.
- E Not Out. The ball pitched outside the line of leg stump.

## LIMITED PARTICIPATION IN RESERVE GAMES

Clubs are reminded that the agreed aims of the Reserve competitions are to provide recreational cricket and to act as a pathway for young players into hardball cricket.

**Every Club has a responsibility to uphold these aims** 

- In addition to those NoSCA Senior League players on the list opposite and overleaf, any player who played 2 or more games in the following leagues in 2018 is automatically included on the NoSCA Limited Participation List (LPL).
  - CSL Eastern Premiership
  - East of Scotland CA Championship
  - Western District CU Premier & First Divisions
  - SPCU North East Championship
  - Aberdeenshire Cricket Association Grade 1
- With the exception of those players on the LPL only for bowling performances in NoSCA games, all players on the LPL must retire on reaching (or passing) 20 runs.
- With the exception of those players on the LPL only for batting performances in NoSCA games, no player on the LPL may bowl in NoSCA Reserve competition matches.
- Notwithstanding any of the above, all players under the age of 16 on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2018 are exempt from the LPL and do not have to retire when batting (applies to all competitions).
- A maximum of 3 LPL players are permitted in any team in a Reserve competition game. It is the responsibility of the team captain to inform their opposite number (and any appointed umpires) <u>before the toss is made</u> of the presence of all players in his team appearing on the LPL.
- Clubs may apply to the NoSCA Executive for an exemption for any player on the LPL who wishes to retire from senior cricket and play in the reserves in the coming season. Each case with be considered on its individual merits.
