	The representatives spoke about the above and the role that they play. They asked for questions.	
	Q. How do they define competitive cricket? A. Organised league cricket	
	Q. What happens if somebody plays who isn't registered? A. Final details are still to be confirmed, however reflective registration may be an option.	
	Q. What do people get from Cricket Scotland? A. The registration system does offer a discount scheme. The reps also asked what people would like to get from this system.	
	Q. Will the price be going up yearly? A. No, they can't see it going up hugely and it may be frozen.	
	Q. Will clubs still pay a CS registration? A. No	
	Q. What is the anticipated income generation of the scheme? A. Possibly £60,000, which will be ring fenced for domestic cricket.	
	Q. Umpires currently do not receive feedback if they raise a complaint. A. Paul Macari will pick this up with CSMOA	
	Charles finished by saying they would welcome feedback and provided email addresses for all. The representatives left the meeting.

	There was a query about the minute of the meeting held on 21 <sup>st</sup> February as to whether or not development league games would be played on Sunday 7 <sup>th</sup> May (Coronation Weekend).
